RE: FRESH PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION

Further to our telephone conversations regarding the joint consultative meeting agreed to be held on Wednesday the 27th of September, 2017 at 9:00am at the National Tallying Centre [NTC], at the Bomas of Kenya, I write to share with you, key points discussed by the Plenary on emerging issues related to the fresh presidential election.

The Commission has had an opportunity to contextualise the issues variously emerging from the Supreme Court Judgment, as well as the issues raised by the different Candidates, their representatives, and the different stakeholders concerning the above subject. The Commission is minded to conduct the fresh presidential election in full and strict compliance with the Constitution, all electoral laws and applicable regulations as well as Orders of the Supreme Court. The Commission asserts its independence under Section 26, IEBC Act and Art. 249(2), Constitution; but nonetheless, in accordance with the Commission's Constitutional mandate, and in assuring the Kenyan electorate and all our stakeholders that the fresh election is free, fair and credible; the Commission welcomes continued broad-constructive engagement with Kenyans and our stakeholders even as we provide guidance on the way forward with regard to guaranteeing the integrity of the subject elections to wit the Commission has made the following resolutions:

(i) Stakeholder Engagement

Conduct structured meetings *viz*:

- Set-out agenda/action points for each meeting and share with all Parties ahead of the meeting; and,
- Communicate resolutions arrived at through regular joint press releases after each joint consultative meeting.

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
